For decades, the unified budget has been standard in many of our churches. A unified budget basically pools both assets and expenses, and asks people to contribute to a general fund and trust those who manage the financial decisions to allocate it appropriately. Though this method is very easy to follow, it often has a disempowering effect on those who give. We like to know where our money goes, what it actually does, and we like some say in how it is used.

Many churches have developed a hybrid form of budgeting that asks people to commit a percentage of their financial support to a general fund, but then allows each giver to designate a portion of their giving to specific work, ministries, or projects in the church. In both cases, the general support is promoted as essential and important. Here are two examples of financial commitment forms used in churches:
